Bats in the Woodlands?

Recently a Woodlands homeowner raised a question about bats often seen in the Woodlands. Bats are nocturnal mammals that feed on flying insects. They hibernate for six months during the winter usually in caves and migrate to wooded areas in the summer where they roost under the loose bark of dead or dying trees. Bats are extremely helpful with insect pest control eating up to 3,000 to 7,000 insects a night. However, it's important to remember that bats are wild animals and may carry rabies just like skunks, foxes, and raccoons. Bats can find their way into basements, attics, or garages and it's important to take precaution when encountering a bat. Information about rabies and Indiana wildlife, including bats, can be found in the Indiana State

Department of Health Epidemiology Resource Center Quick Facts Bulletin https://secure.in.gov/isdh/files/2015QuickFact_ Rabies.pdf.
