Since we have new resurfaced courts, I am going to be strict only allowing tennis players on the courts. No dogs, skateboards, etc. should be on the courts. Please adhere to the rules and please be mindful of other players when on the courts. Again, **ONLY TENNIS** should be played on the courts. Please continue to help me take care of the courts by throwing away your trash etc.

This is going to be another great summer!!! Our two dynamic instructors are returning for the 3rd time this summer for our Summer Tennis Lessons. Our lead instructor is Sam Luke. Sam L. has played tennis since he was 7. He was in the Washington Township program until his sophomore year and then switched to IRC (Indianapolis Tennis Club). He has had been in tennis lessons, camps and workshops for many, many years. He also taught in the Washington Township program working with the tennis tots and the elementary kids. Swim Lessons

Lessons will be held Monday-Friday for a ONE-week period. You may sign up for multiple sessions. Cost per session is \$15 cash or check payable to Woodlands Homeowners Association. Payment must accompany form and homeowner must be in good standing. Classes are filled on a first-come basis.

Swimmers will be grouped based on ability and age. By signing up for swim lessons, you acknowledge that it is the responsibility of the Pool Managers and staff to move children up OR down in level based on ability and space.

Minnows: Child learns to be comfortable in the water. Work on putting face in and floating. Children learn the arm movements of swimming and kicking. They also learn to get back to the wall if they fall or jump in. (Kids sit on the steps.)

Flying Fish: Child needs to be comfortable in the water and be able to swim a little by themselves. Children learn freestyle with side breathing. They also learn the backstroke.

Sting Rays: Children need to be able to swim the width of the pool without stopping. Work is done on freestyle and backstroke while learning breaststroke and diving.

Marlins: Child should be able to swim the width of the pool backstroke and freestyle. Continue working on breaststroke and learn butterfly. Also work on starts, finishes, and turns.

Sharks: Child needs to know all four strokes and be able to swim a lap of each legally. Work on stroke technique, starts, turns, finishes, and speed.

Grounds Report

So, what is the deal with all of the rocks? I'm sure that you have been curious about all the rocks that are spread over the spillway coming from the lake. Well, curious or not, you are going to learn a bit about why the rocks are there.

If you go up to the lake, you will see a variety of rocks of different sizes and shapes strewn across the spillway. The proper term for this rock (usually granite or limestone) is "riprap," or "rip-rap." Riprap is rock that is used to armor shorelines, streambeds, bridge abutments, etc. against water erosion. Most of the riprap on the spillway of our "high risk dam" is made up of rocks weighing between ten and fifteen pounds (although we do have smaller and larger rocks). Periodically, it is necessary to replace some of the rock-armor on the dam because the alternating cold and warm weather we experience in Central Indiana causes the rock to break up, and a good portion of the smaller stuff is washed downstream. As reported in our recent dam inspection, the Woodlands is responsible for maintaining the dam, and one of the tasks we have been given is the replacement of the riprap. If you walk along the stream that flows through the clubhouse property from the dam you will notice that wire containers (boxes or baskets) filled with riprap line the banks at certain points. These rock-filled containers are called "gabions," and the intent is to armor (protect) the banks of the stream from water

erosion in the same way that the loose riprap protects the spillway.

As responsible members of the community, all of us need to do our part to maintain the riprap armor.

1. Please do not throw the larger riprap into the lake. Any riprap thrown into the water will need to be replaced, and the large rocks near the edge of the lake make it difficult for boaters and fishermen to launch their crafts.
2. Please do not build bridges from one side of the stream to the other using the riprap. This practice removes the riprap from where it is needed, and it also clogs the stream and prevents proper drainage.
3. If you want to walk up to the lake, make sure that you are wearing proper footwear (flip-flops can be dangerous). It would be easier to walk up the right side of the spillway instead of trying to negotiate the riprap.

It is hoped that this info has been helpful. Of course, if you have the urge, feel free to throw or skip some of the smaller rocks.

Little Free Libraries in the Woodlands

Two neighbors in the Woodlands have provided the community with a free gift! They have constructed and are maintaining Little Free Libraries in their front yards. Maybe you have seen them as you have been out walking. One is located at 10804 Braewick Dr. and the other is at 10807 Lakeview Dr. A Little Free Library is a wooden box containing books that anyone can take for free... and there isn't a return date or a late fee! If you like the book you can keep it! Book donations are appreciated to help maintain a diverse selection in the library. The Little Free Library idea was started in Wisconsin in 2009 and is wide spread across the U.S. and into other countries.

The Little Free Library on Lakeview was started about a year ago because neighbors were so welcoming to the couple when they moved in they wanted to give back to the neighborhood. Love of reading made them interested in the concept of the Little Free Library so they ordered a pre-made box. Their library sits on a table with chairs nearby so readers can sit and enjoy the books. They enjoy watching families on a walk stop by to read or people hop out of their car to drop off books. They keep the box stocked with a variety of topics and like to see what other people are reading when books are donated. If they provide a brand new title they ask that it be returned. Often kids will find surprises in the box in addition to a book!

Stephanie Sullivan on Braewick saw a Little Free Library and decided it would be a fun way to share her love of reading. Her husband Shawn likes to woodwork so he designed the box and built it. A bench is nearby for anyone to stop and read. Stephanie says about 10-15

families, primarily with younger children, use it regularly. They have enjoyed watching people read together on the bench. At Halloween the Sullivans sit on the bench to hand out books and candy. Like the Lakeview Library, surprises for kids can sometimes be found alongside the books! They have even been known to have dog biscuits in the box in case you need to treat your pet while perusing the collection.

March 13, 2017

Welcome and Call to Order: Andy Nist welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m.

2016 Board Highlights:

Pool: Ross Sexter said the last year was successful. He announced our previous head guard Maddie Cottrell is moving on and the new head guard is Jessica Deady. Forty percent of the guards are returning. Will have adult volleyball on Sundays again as well as movie night. Projects this summer include resurfacing the diving board and repairs to baby pool. Will continue to study turning baby pool into splash pad.

Grounds: Jeff Kempson received results from dam inspection

from engineer and will be following up on recommendations this summer which include removal of saplings on dam and placing riprap fallen into the creek back on bank. Improvements to boat storage area include sinking posts to secure boats and possibly moving boats to other side of dam. Additional projects if volunteer effort is available such as making a path to lead up to dam and boat area on lake. Andy thanked Jeff for his efforts on dam and communications with DNR and an independent contractor for inspection on the high hazard dam.

who moved to S.C. Maintenance included repairing support post in basement and run-off area near garage. Thanked Pat for his hands-on work.

Activities: Amanda Tutino reported that new activities were supported this year as well as the usual events. The date for the garage sale will be on June 2 this year.

Tennis: Melina Nash announced that the courts were finally resurfaced. Same fantastic instructors coming back for June and July lessons as well as fall lessons. Pickle ball lines are now on the courts. Nets are up.

Membership: Linda Withrow is working to connect neighbors. Using mail chimp service to deliver news and announcements to neighbors who sign up. Always a way to unsubscribe at bottom of each email. Invited all class C members to join and 9 new members have joined. Membership papers completed by homeowners provided names for new board directors. Hoping to connect neighbors and services. "Neighbor to Neighbor Services" Directory coming out next month and will include lists by alphabetized names and street numbers. Accepting advertisements for directory. New lock box outside clubhouse for dues. Attended the roundabout meeting at Clay Middle School. An app has been created to help motorists find a way around town during construction. Construction starting this spring. Provided handouts from the meeting.

Budget: Books will be examined by third party. Finances in good shape. Finished \$30,000 better. Didn't get around to doing some of the projects that had been discussed. Not all projects on list are in budget. If tracking well on budget will try to chip away at project list. Taxable income reduced due to interest on loan. Expecting no additional outlay on fed and state taxes due to loan. The CPA researched that we pay taxes because we don't qualify as a not for profit. Question: What is goal of rainy day fund and where are we? Answer: Loan with balance of about \$70,000. Did not pay off loan to allow for reserve. Want to maintain \$100-\$150,000 in reserve to be able to do projects and still maintain payroll in summer. Have had to spend \$45,000 one year on pool and \$30,000 for dam another year. Don't want to be in situation to take out another loan. Question: How are we doing collecting fees? Answer: Online payments increasing. \$40,000 in outstanding dues. \$10,000 is from repeat offenders that have never paid us. Will be sending out email reminder.

Administration: Secured an agreement with CPA for an

evaluation of our books. Bridge on Lakeshore Drive South completed. Forest Dale stormwater project on Lakeview Drive has been reseeded.

Board Candidates

Nominating Committee was small. Had volunteers for each position this year based on membership forms.

President: Tim McCullough 28 years in neighborhood.

Vice President: Jim Copsey 4 years in neighborhood.

Treasurer: Dave Fellabaum 12 years in neighborhood. Getting all information in Quick Books.

Grounds Director: Jeff Kempson 20 years. Live close to clubhouse. Looking forward to following through on plans made in first term.

Clubhouse Directory: Mike Pipke Lived here since 1994.

Co-Activities: Wanda Kenney. 17 years

Asked for motion to close nominations. Steve Matthews motioned. Motion was seconded. No nominations from floor. All in favor.

Asked for a motion to accept treasurer's report as stated. Steve Matthews motioned. Linda Withrow seconded. All in favor.

Andy announced John Woods passed away this past week and recognized his work in Carmel and the neighborhood. If there is interest to fill John's role for the north side please talk with Tim.
