POOL NEWS

As we transition into the cooler months, here's a summary of the key activities and updates for our community pool:

Financials: All bills have been paid and were under budget.

Pool Closure: The pool has been locked up and has been officially winterized.

Maintenance: The top railing for the stairs was fixed, though the bottom is still loose.

11 chairs were refurbished.

The ladders have been re-anchored, with one to be replaced once the pool is drained.

The baby pool leak source has been identified and will be patched.

The skimmer was repaired.

The cover was replaced after someone fell through it.

Safety and Security: Lifeguard chairs need repair or replacement due to instability.

There was an incident involving individuals trying to access the pool area after closing hours. Unfortunately, some fences were damaged in the process. We are currently addressing the

issue.

Operational Issues: The gate lock software is linked to the old Wi-Fi router; an update is being addressed. The

issue with bathroom cleanliness during swim meets has been discussed with Aquatic.

Future Plans: A new Venmo account will be created for next year.

Pool rules will be updated in the off-season.

The grill will be replaced.

We appreciate the community's support and look forward to another great season next year. If you have any questions or suggestions, please let us know.

LAKE AND GROUNDS UPDATES

As we continue to maintain and improve our community, here are the latest updates on our ground's maintenance:

- **Storm Cleanup**: Trees and limbs from storms were cleaned up.
- Hornets' Nest: A hornets' nest was removed from the clubhouse grounds.
- **Jones RX Ponds**: A new lake management firm has been hired. Ideally, the neighborhood will receive better communication for pond treatment days and other activities.
- Railroad Ties: The board has approved the removal of railroad ties.

A special thank you goes out to Larry Rich and Mike Pipke for their endless support of the Woodlands Homeowners Association facilities. Your hard work and dedication have not gone unnoticed, and we sincerely appreciate all you do to keep our community thriving.

CLUBHOUSE

Here are the latest updates on clubhouse repairs, enhancements, and maintenance:

New Installations and Repairs:

- A smart thermostat was installed to replace the older not-so-smart unit
- A broken overhead garage door spring, as well as the door rail wheels, were replaced
- A faulty dusk-to-dawn sensor on the lamp post at the bottom of the front steps was replaced
- o A GFCI electrical outlet was installed above the TV room's kitchen sink

Security Enhancements:

- A dusk-to-dawn flood light was installed on the clubhouse roof and aimed toward the dumpster and bicycle rack areas of the grounds
- We ordered and installed Private Property signs to help deter trespassing on the grounds. They
 are positioned near the clubhouse parking entrance, at the footbridge over the stream, and
 soon, on the tennis court fencing

Maintenance and Cleaning:

- Wildlife (squirrels, birds, bats) have infiltrated clubhouse crawlspace, attic, and wall spaces over time. Approved by the WHA board of directors, AAA Exterminating evacuates the critters and seals structure gaps to prevent their return. The bats cannot be addressed until Spring 2025 because of the cold season. They are hibernating through the winter
- The board approved our resuming an agreement with Northside Window and Gutter Cleaning to provide semi-annual window (exterior and interior) cleaning services. Service will begin in Spring 2025



TENNIS

Our two beautiful tennis courts are free for use by Association members anytime, except during scheduled tennis lessons or when reserved for open play pickleball. The south court is also lined for pickleball and features two rolling, all-weather pickleball nets.
